**Subject:- Self Certification of Nursing Schools (GNM/ANM).**

1. The Government has been receiving number of complaints in regard to lack of requisite facilities and non-fulfillment of standards by the Nursing Institutions in the state of Punjab. Inspection of some schools revealed number of short-comings – institutions running from rented accommodation for last many years, hostels in rented buildings, hostel in multiple places, lack of facilities in college and hostels, inadequate staff, no land of own etc. The institutions could obtain affiliation from INC and Punjab Nursing Registration Council in some of the cases on the basis of incomplete reports of the Inspectors who did not do a thorough job. The accurate and authentic information about the facilities in the Nursing Schools is therefore not available with the government/PNRC

2. The Government feels that all the institutions should provide the stipulated facilities as per the INC/PNRC norms. They should also comply with the NOC conditions. It is important that they construct their own school and hostel building as per NOC conditions. They should also provide stipulated facilities in the Colleges and Hostels.

3. There is therefore an urgent need to collect correct and authentic data about the institutions. The Government has decided that before a detailed inspection of the institutions is carried out the **Principal of the respective Nursing institutions would conduct an indepth survey of their own institution and submit a report in the performa enclosed herewith.** They can attach extra sheets if necessary. If there is any deficiency that should be clearly admitted and action plan should be submitted for removing the deficiency. Needless to mention that these reports would be verified by the State Government and in case of submission of wrong information by the Principal, strict action would be taken against them in the shape of striking off their registration from the PNRC registers.

4. This is a time bound work and the Principals are **directed to send the report positively by 31/3/2004**. The Government/PNRC would start inspections from the first week of April, 2004.
